

Public Hearing held Tuesday August 1, 2006

The Board of Supervisors conducted a public hearing on Tuesday August 1, 2006 commencing at 7:00 p.m. Chairman Hensel called the public hearing to order. Present were Supervisors Ms. Silvernail and Mr. Doratt, Mr. Thompson substitute Township Solicitor, Mr. MacCombie Township Engineer, and members of the community.

Mr. Hensel turned the public hearing over to Mr. Thompson. Mr. Thompson stated that this public hearing has been advertised in the Daily Local News and marked exhibits T-1 as proof of publication, T-2 being an Ordinance that amends chapter 56 to be known as the Sadsbury Township Contractor Registration Ordinance. Mr. Thompson added that this Ordinance would require all contractors working within the Township to register with the Township and show proof of insurance. Mr. Thompson stated the fees will be established by the Board of Supervisors by Resolution.

Public Comment:

Chief Groce asked if the Ordinance includes alarm installations. Mr. Thompson answered if it requires a permit than it requires a contractor registration.

John Lymberis asked if the new zoning officer got a copy of the Ordinance? The Board stated yes.

Earl Taylor asked who the new building inspector in the Township is? The Board answered Atlantic Inland of Broomall.

Elmer Pluck asked if there was a definition of contractor within the Ordinance. Mr. Thompson stated yes it is defined.

With there being no further public comment the hearing was adjourned.

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Mr. Thompson stated that he would open the floor for another public hearing to discuss an Ordinance pertaining to the collection of garbage, rubbish and refuse within the Township by adding new definitions, by revising fees and adding new provisions for recycling.

Mr. Thompson marked exhibits T-1 as the proof of publication in the Daily Local News and T-2 as the original ordinance. Mr. Thompson stated that the Ordinance allows for (2) 32-gallon containers not weighing more than fifty-five pounds each and (2) securely tied bundles of material not exceeding 2 feet in length and two bags. The rate established per EDU is \$298.00 per year. The pick up date and time will remain on Friday. Mr. Thompson added that all recycle material should be separated from other municipal waste and placed in a separate reusable container.

Public Comment:

Susan Franco asked if yard waste is allowed? The Board answered no.

Elmer Pluck asked if the 32-gallon containers would be supplied from the trash hauler? The Board stated no, but the re-cycle bins will be provided.

Libby Gorse asked if she could place two bags out instead of two cans? The Board stated as long as it's not more than 55 pounds heavy.

Earl Taylor made a comment that he can remember re-cycling years ago and they could not dispose of #1 and #2 bottles.

With there being no further questions the hearing was adjourned.
