

Meeting of the Sadsbury Township Planning Commission

November 15, 2023

A meeting of the Sadsbury Township Planning Commission was held on Wednesday, November 15, 2023 at 7:00 PM in the Sadsbury Township Municipal Building.

Present: Mr. John Lymberis, Ms. Amanda Stewart, Mr. Clark Faggioli, Mr. Simon Jessey, Mr. Ron Zaroni, and Ms. Michelle Falcone.

Absent: Mr. Jeremy Alcorn, Supervisor Liaison Mr. John Moore.

Mr. Lymberis called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, followed by a moment of silence and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Faggioli made a motion, seconded by Ms. Stewart, to approve and adopt the minutes of the previous meeting. With no amendments or questions, the motion passed unanimously.

Speed Limit Signs in Sadsbury Park

The Planning Commission was unable to provide any assistance with identifying places to put speed limit signs because

- Members are not engineers and are not familiar with the legal requirements for sign placement
- No members of the public from Sadsbury Park appeared at the meeting to offer their views

Township Noise Ordinance Discussion

The Commission discussed the noise ordinance and identified two competing issues:

1. The need for the ordinance to be simplified so that it could be enforced by Township officials without needing to bring in paid consultants.
2. The need to protect the Township from any legal jeopardy arising from any ambiguity in the ordinance.

Ron Zaroni has offered to look into the matter and come up with some recommendations.

Announcements, Correspondence and Public Comment

Mr. Jessey announced that three new members were appointed to the Sadsbury Township Review Committee (STORC). Mr. Jessey announced that the Township had agreed to try to make a WiFi printer available to the Commission. Mr. Lymberis stated a street light had been replaced that had been knocked over. Mr. Lymberis was interviewed by *Mainline Today* about Sadsburyville.

With there being no further announcements or public comment, Ms. Stewart made a motion, seconded by M. Zaroni, to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 PM. With there being no further questions, the motion passed unanimously.
